

During his career in the Air Force he served as a fighter pilot, flight instructor and Squadron Commander as well as serving in the Pentagon and North American Defense Command. Overseas he served a tour in Iceland and two tours in Thailand (once as a liaison to the Thai Air Force and the other as a combat fighter pilot in the Viet Nam conflict). He retired a highly decorated officer in 1979.

Bob then worked as a Systems Engineer for Martin Marietta and General Dynamics on the Titan Missile program. He retired in 1993.

He was an active member of St. James by-the-Sea Episcopal Church in La Jolla. He served on the Vestry, as a Lector and assisted in the serving of communion as a Chalice Bearer.

He was an active member, racer and instructor here at the Convair Sailing Club for many years, and a regular participant with the Thursday SuperSloopers.
